The meeting was called to order at 7:41 P.M. by President Van Stine.

Both Pres V and Manny expressed how proud they both were to nominate these five remarkable people.

After some detailed discussion on the background and qualifications of each of these new members, a motion was made by Pres V, second by Manny, to approve the five individuals for Rotary membership. Motion approved unanimously.

Pres V. emphasized that the most important focus we ca have right now is bringing on the new member base BUT at the same time that he did NOT want to bring on any more new members until after our club charter was recertified as the Rotary Club of New Jersey

In conclusion, Pres V and Dave discussed the ability of the Spectra Care Foundation to accept donations from a Donor Trust, as well as the flexibility and non-conflict in using the SCF as a foundation directly aligned with our club.
